The Why: in numbers

- 41% of people in forced migration are children
- 10% are unaccompanied
 - Children are specific targets
- 43,000 Unaccompanied minors arrived in the EU in 2023
- the number of months of your excrutiating journey
- The number of persons lost or left behind
- The months spend waiting
- The number of your asylum claim
- $\rightarrow \rightarrow \rightarrow$ How can you exist, be seen, be supported as you? As a child FIRST AND FOREMOST?
